<u>The deadline for abstract submission for the 37th International Meeting of Sedimentology in Aberdeen is fast approaching (24th of November) – here's a guide on how to submit your abstract:</u>

- 1) Do a sedimentology thing and write about it. Up to 50 words for the title. 300 for the main text.
- 2) Click on this link below. Create an account and sign in.

- 3) Copy your title into the title box. Select either oral or poster. Or 'either'.
- 4) Select a theme to help abstract processing. At this stage you will only be asked to select from:
 - Marine carbonate;
 - Marine siliciclastic;
 - Other;
 - Terrestrial carbonate;
 - Terrestrial siliciclastic.
- 5) Copy and paste abstract main text into the Abstract Upload box.
- 6) In the "Other" theme box in the "additional information" section you can optionally suggest the name of a session that your abstract might fit. If you are keen on suggesting a particular session, then please type this into the "Other" theme box. For example, members of the "tidalites" community can all type "tidalites" into this box when submitting their relevant abstracts, highlighting demand for a session to the organisers. There is significant capacity at the conference venue, so we will include as many themes, sessions talks and posters as possible.
- 7) In the Additional Information section please also tick all boxes that apply. This includes confirming attendance; author approval; publishing of the abstract on the website; and eligibility for prizes.
- 8) Review.
- 9) Submit. Before the 24th of November.
- 10) Conference registration is on a different site (University of Aberdeen online store, accessible via www.iasaberdeen2024.org). Please don't forget to register, and please book early to avoid disappointment for fieldtrips, as capacity on the trips is limited (because Scotland is popular with tourists).
